Spartan Club CCLC Before and After School Program

Spartan Club is a comprehensive before- and after-school care program serving all students in grades 3K through 8th. Designed to provide a safe, engaging, and supportive environment, the program offers students opportunities to continue learning, growing, and exploring their interests at no cost to families. Spartan Club operates before school from 7:00–8:00 a.m. and after school from 3:30–5:15 p.m., and is conveniently located in the school cafeteria, with transportation home available for Delavan area residents. The program places a strong emphasis on supporting students who may need additional academic or social support, ensuring equitable access and opportunities for success. Students receive assistance with homework and school projects, while also participating in a variety of enrichment activities such as art, science experiments, sports, and character-building programs that promote positive decision-making. Typically a daily schedule is:

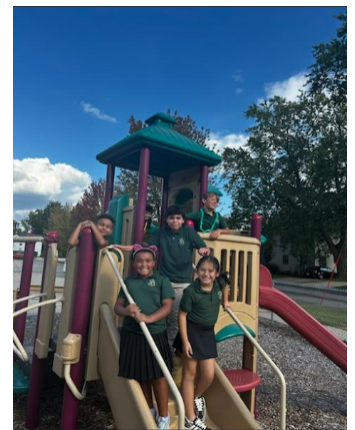
3:00 - 3:30 Arrival/Snack

- **Financial Literacy Parent Event:**

This event supported families by providing practical tools and knowledge around saving and budgeting. By equipping parents and guardians with financial strategies, the program extended its impact beyond students and into the home.

- **Strong Homework & Tutoring Support:**

- This year, students benefited from consistent homework help and targeted tutoring, giving them the extra support they needed to build confidence and stay on track academically. With dedicated staff available, students were able to ask questions, strengthen their understanding, and develop better study habits, leading to improved classroom performance and reduced stress at home.

- **Engaging, Hands-On Activities:**
